#### SUBJECT INFORMATION

**Honors and Advanced options:** For students in grades 9-12, history and literature classes are offered at both our standard Honors level or at a more rigorous level, designated as Advanced. Our Calculus courses are also Advanced courses. Students in the Advanced courses receive a .5 increase in their course G.P.A.

**History/Literature:** 9th and 10th grade students combine in even years to study the Medieval/Renaissance period, and the European/Early Modern era in odd years. Similarly, juniors and seniors join together to study the American/Modern era in even years and Government/Great Books in the odd years. Students have the option to choose between the Honors or Advanced level for these classes.

**Math:** Levels shown represent the standard program. Some students may track one level behind or ahead of the standard program. For those students who track a level ahead, students can take Advanced Calculus II which will prepare students for the Calculus BC exam. Advanced Calculus I prepares student for the Calculus AB exam.

**Science:** Students can take four lab sciences in high school. Chemistry and Physics are offered in alternate years.

**Latin:** Levels shown indicate the standard tracking. Latin I is available for new students starting in the 8th grade. Graduation requirements include three years of foreign language for all students.
