

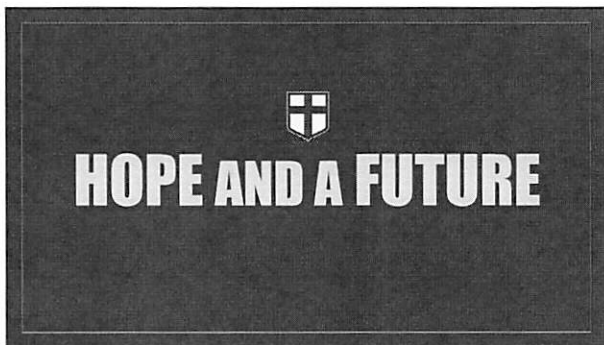
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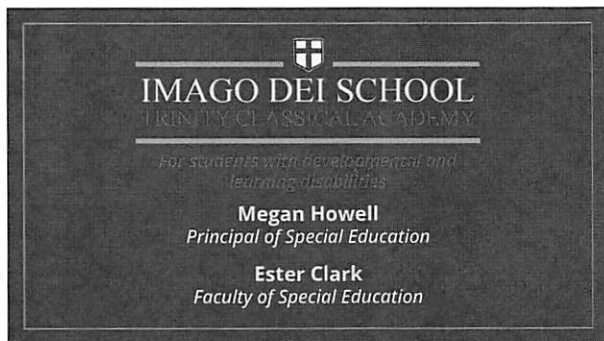
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## History of the Imago Dei School

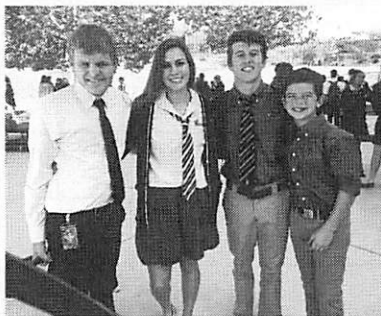


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**Imago Dei provides ...**

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

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## Educational Therapy

**Candidates:** Students who experience obvious frustration in areas of school performance such as poor spelling, illegible handwriting, or difficulty with reading or math

**What are the distinctives of Educational Therapy?**

- Program through the National Institute of learning Development
- Addresses root learning issues, helping learners overcome these issues by developing new learning paths.
- One on one sessions twice per week for 80 minutes
- Addresses cognition, perception, academics, emotions

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### Great Dei Businesses

- **Vocational training** for 11th and 12th graders. Internships for 18-22 year old Transitional students. Ongoing employment for Imago Dei graduates as adults.

- **Provides Christian, adult community,** supported employment, and ongoing job training for graduates with disabilities.



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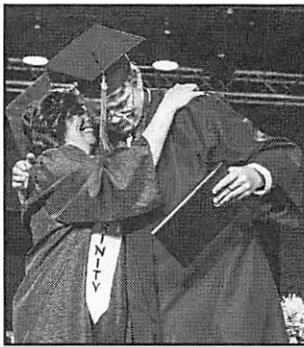
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### Imago Dei Diploma

The Imago Dei diploma is equivalent to a certificate of completion. Transcripts reflect a modified curriculum that does not meet the CA State high school graduation requirements.

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The success of your program will largely depend on your special education team.

Hire quality people. Train them to understand learning, behaviors and disabilities.

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### Prepare Your School Community

Set everyone up for success by **clearly communicating expectations:**

- **Mainstream Faculty:**  
Train faculty on expectations. How to guide their own students and how to interact with yours.
- **Students:**  
What to expect. How to be a good friend. It's OK to ask questions. How to respond to the unexpected.

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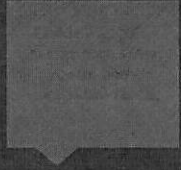

- Gained 5 grade levels in 3 years - now above GL in reading and math



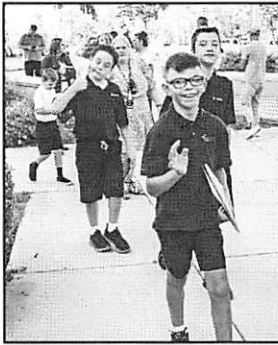

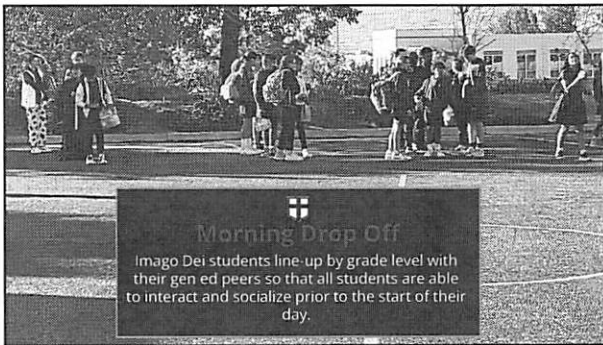
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## Morning Drop Off

Imago Dei students line-up by grade level with their gen ed peers so that all students are able to interact and socialize prior to the start of their day.

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## Morning Exercise

Before our students move into class, we begin with physical activity such as hill or stair repeats and stretches

→ Purpose

To prepare students for their day ahead and workout some energy.

→ Benefit by CDC Healthy Schools

Exercise can improve student concentration and ability to stay on-task in the classroom.

Students follow a structured schedule both in the Imago Dei classroom and in the gen ed classroom for students that mainstream.

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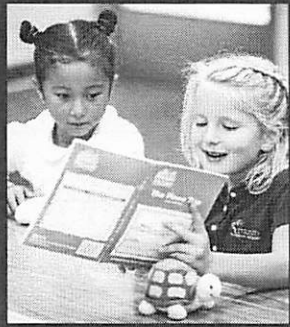
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## Language Arts

- Reading comprehension



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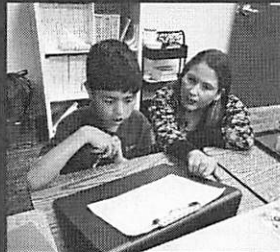

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


## Language Arts Rotations

Multi-modality

Small group or individual lessons

Students rotate through different stations of no more than 3 student : 1 teacher



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## Math

### Math In Focus Curriculum

- Same curriculum as gen ed, modified in pacing according to the student's needs
- Lesson with teacher, individual or small group
- Manipulatives
- Repetition and practice
- Followed by support rotations

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### Classroom Aides

- Trained in the basic principles of Applied Behavior Analysis
- Essential academic support during lessons
- Support students during the challenging, less structured times such as lunch, recess and PE
- Teach academic support rotations such as math facts fluency, penmanship
- Monitor student progress toward individual goals. Collect data.
- Help students meet academic and behavior expectations during mainstreaming
- Accompany students to mainstreaming

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### Student Breaks

Students take a 2 minute break after each rotation. Ex: Reading, sensory, or full body movement break. Additional sensory or self regulation breaks are allowed following a student's individual plan.

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### Mainstreaming

Mainstreaming is an important part of the Imago Dei education. Students mainstream for co-curricular classes and academics where it is successful for a student's individual academic plan. Trinity faculty and students welcome their Imago Dei peers into their classrooms. It's just the "way we do school" at Trinity.

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## Art and Music

With support from Imago Dei staff, students join their grade-level peers for music and art class, learning to use their God-given voices and artistic talents in a disciplined and God-honoring way.

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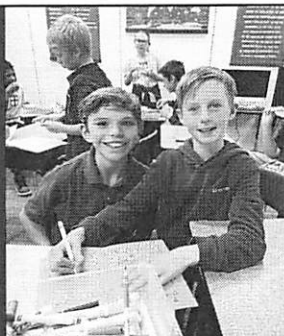
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## Noble Knights

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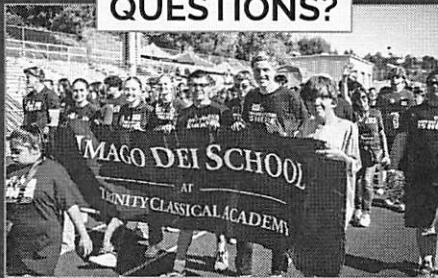
