
All creatures of our God and King, Lift up your voice and with us sing, Alleluia! Alleluia!






Spelling: Spelling Rules, Phonogram hints and Mnemonics

Penmanship: write the cursive alphabet twice each day without dotting or crossing. If you don't teach penmanship formally, you can write the alphabet twice as a warm up before the first writing exercise of the day.

Literature: Fiction vs Non-Fiction, Informative, Narrative, Poetry types
